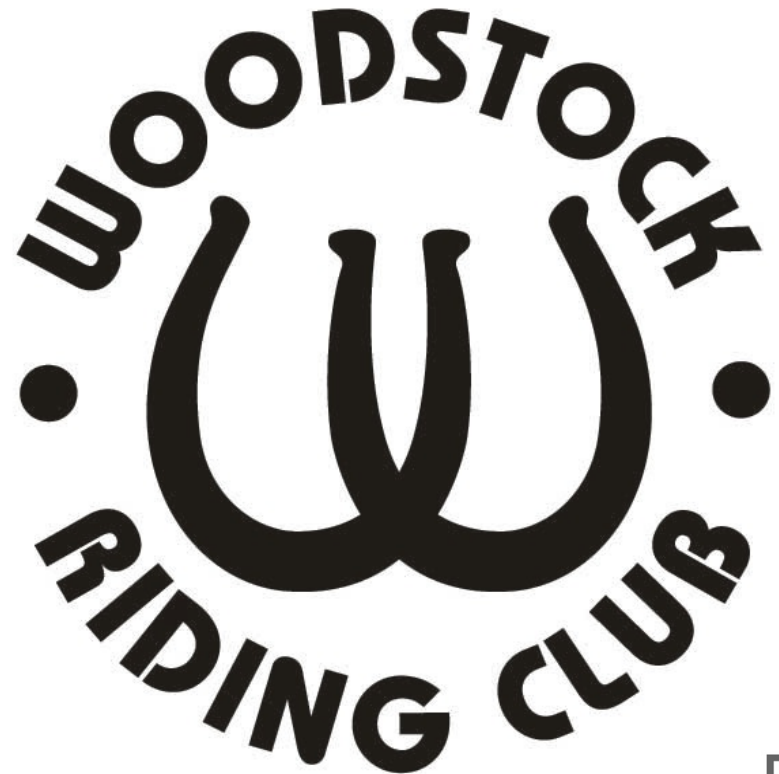

- 3. Brighter Days Memorial Trophy: awarded to the high point Novice horse and rider.

*Perpetual Trophies will be engraved and presented at the annual awards banquet. They will be displayed in the trophy case outside the clubhouse at every show.

General Rules and Information

- ▶ All riders/exhibitors 18 years and under must wear properly fitted protective headgear which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) Standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and helmet must be properly fitted; this includes in hand classes. All riders in all classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds must wear protective headgear. Any rider/exhibitor violating this rule at any time will immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Woodstock Riding Club strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the club grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It is the responsibility of the rider, or parent or guardian, or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use and is properly fitted and in good condition. The Woodstock Riding Club makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as such no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

- ▶ All shows will start promptly: June 4/5 at 9am, July 10 at 8am, September 11 at 8am and October 2 at 9am.
- ▶ Alcohol is prohibited on show grounds. Anyone drinking or intoxicated will be asked to leave the grounds. Failure to cooperate may result in forfeiture of points and further showing.
- ▶ Schooling is allowed in designated areas only. Lunging in the lunge area only. There will be NO trotting or cantering outside of the rings.
- ▶ No schooling is allowed over the trail course. Failure to observe rules will result in forfeiture of any entry fees and disqualification.
- ▶ For safety, all dogs and other pets must be confined or on a leash. Motor bikes and bicycles must be walked (motors shut off) when on the show grounds.
- ▶ No horses are to be turned out in any of the rings.
- ▶ Junior horses 5 years and under may be shown in a western under saddle class in a snaffle bit or bosal ridden with two hands. Bits must conform to rules of the USA Equestrian Federation. If this option is taken, it must be consistent in all classes. No mechanical hackamores are permitted.
- ▶ Spurs, crops or bats are optional.

Barn Rules

- ▶ **At no time may animals be left unsupervised on WRC grounds.**
- ▶ All juniors must have senior member supervision for all overnight stays.
- ▶ Limited stabling is available. Reservations are recommended; please call Carla Picayo at 845-247-0546.
- ▶ Stall reservations require payment at time of reservation.
- ▶ Please call Carla Picayo by the Monday prior to the show if you are not using your season stall. It is the stall renters responsibility to notify the barn manager if the stalls are not going to be used.
- ▶ No stalls shall be used as tack rooms. Stalls are open to equines only.
- ▶ Members may not sublet stalls.
- ▶ Stall fees: \$15/members, \$20/non-members for day of show. \$5 additional for overnight (arriving day prior to show). Seasonal stalls are \$60 for members, \$70 for non-members.
- ▶ 2 seasonal stalls will be available to paid members after January 1 of the current year. After April 1, if any stalls remain, they will become available to non-members on a first come, first served basis. Stalls must be cleaned after each use. If not, charges will occur.
- ▶ Exhibitors must furnish their own supplies and care of mounts. At times shavings may be available for purchase. Call ahead for availability.
- ▶ No tying or cross tying horses to barn poles.
- ▶ RV electric hook up prohibited.

Riding and Showing Rules and Information

- **NEW FOR 2011!! Our shows are PAC approved and recognized for AMHA Open Competition High Point Awards!**
- ▶ All exhibitors/riders must have a signed "Disclaimer of Liability" on file at the secretary's stand before entering their first class or riding on the club grounds.
- ▶ Anyone 18 and under riding, driving and/or showing a horse on the club grounds must wear an approved ASTM/SEI certified helmet. This includes all in hand classes.
- ▶ All riders, regardless of age, must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet when schooling or showing over jumps.

Class and Award Eligibility

Walk/Trot/Jog Divisions are for riders 13 and under as of 1/1/11.
Beginner Walk /Trot - for the rider that is in their 1st or 2nd year of showing.
Advanced Walk /Trot - for the rider that is in their 3rd or more years of showing walk/ trot.

Riders in the above divisions CAN NOT have shown in a canter or lope class prior to this day.

Adult Walk/Trot/Jog Division is for riders 14 and over as of 1/1/11 who are not able to canter/lope.

Youth Hunter - Open to all riders 18 & under as of 1/1/11. This is a walk/trot/canter division. Fences will not exceed 18 inches.

Schooling Hunter - Fences not to exceed 18 inches.

Low Hunter - Fences not to exceed 2 feet.

High Hunter - Fences not to exceed 2'6".

Green - Open to horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing.

Novice - Is based on riders eligibility- rider has not won 3 blue ribbons in each class.

Open - Is open to all riders.

Driving - Is open to all.

****Stallions may be entered in Green or Open (including Schooling, Low and High Hunter) Divisions and must be shown by an exhibitor 18 years or older. Stallions are not permitted in any Walk/Trot/Jog or Novice classes.**

Day End Eligibility

- ▶ Must Enter a Minimum of 3 classes in a division to be eligible for day end award.
- ▶ Entries are kept on a one horse , one rider / handler combination. Ties for the Day / or year end awards will be determined by placing received in Equitation class(es).
- ▶ Day End points are kept on a 5/3/2/1 basis.

Year End Eligibility

- ▶ Must be a Woodstock Riding Club member.
- ▶ All members must sign up for membership and year end awards prior to their first class for points to count toward year end awards.
- ▶ Must show in at least 2 of the 3 pointed shows: June 4/5, July 10, September 11.
- ▶ Must show in majority of classes in the division (2 of 3 classes, 3 of 4 classes, etc.).
- ▶ Year end points are kept on a 6/5/4/3/2/1 basis.

- ▶ Pre Registering is available. The entries, when pre registered, must be received the Monday prior to the show and will cost \$8.00 per class. Payment and a copy of a current (within 12 months prior to the show) Coggins test and Rabies certificate must be sent also. If payment and certificates are not present, it will not be accepted as a pre registration. For a form or further information please call Hannah 845-657-8005 or email woodstockridingclub@yahoo.com. Forms are also available on our website: www.woodstockridingclub.com.
- ▶ Entry fees are \$9.00 per class(\$8.00 preregistered) unless otherwise noted. Payment is due at the time of entry by cash or check. Signed blank checks are acceptable. There is a \$10.00 charge for accounts not settled by the end of the day and a \$25.00 charge for returned checks.
- ▶ A current coggins and rabies certificate (within 12 months prior to the show) must be on file at the secretary's stand. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- ▶ Entries are made on a one horse/rider/handler combination.
- ▶ Riders wearing the wrong number will forfeit points. No number results in elimination.
- ▶ Horses will be lined up on the rail as the previous class is being pinned. You must have your horses ready. We can not hold up any class without prior notice of a tack change.
- ▶ Cross entering is encouraged so please plan accordingly and notify the secretary's stand of any tack changes ahead of time.
- ▶ The show committee reserves the right to cancel/combine/split classes as deemed necessary and safe. If there are less than 4 entries in a class, it will be combined appropriately.
- ▶ Trail course will be open for English riders from 11am-1:30pm and for Western riders from 11am-4:30pm at the July and September shows. The trail course will be open to Western riders from 10am-12pm and English riders from 10am-2:30pm at the October show. Trail classes will run as posted in June. If your course is not completed during this time, you will forfeit your entry.
- ▶ Leadline will be held around 1 pm in July and September, around noon in October and as posted in June. Leadliners must be lead on a leadline by a person 16 years of age or older.
- ▶ WRC follows the US Equestrian Federation rules very closely.
- ▶ Judges decision is final.
